What will I need to do to get started?

1. A computer with Internet access.



1. An email account, as well as a Mikenet username and password.

Creating a Mango Account

1. Go to the LLRC website at <http://www2.smcvt.edu/llrc/>
2. Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on Mango Languages. If this link happens to not be there, you can also click on the *language resources* tab on the left, click on the *language* you want to learn, and scroll down to *web based languages*. If Mango is there, it means your language is one of the many supported by Mango.



3. Once having clicked on either of the Mango logos described above, you will be taken to <http://www.smcvt.edu/library/databases/title/mango.asp>, a site that describes Mango Languages.



- Now at the login for off-campus access, type in your Mikenet username and password to create an account. Doing so will bring you to the Mango login page.



- Once here, you will find an option for logging in (something you will want to follow the previous directions for so you may use Mango again later) and another for starting a new account.
- Under **Create a Profile**, type in your email and give a password to start your new account. Press sign up.
- A note will next pop up telling you to check your email for further instructions on your Mango account. Go to your email.

9. Go to your email and you will find an email that looks something like this:

10. Click on the link to be brought to your new account!!

Using Mango Languages

1. Logged into your account, you will automatically be brought to your dashboard. Here you can see what languages you have practiced so far and for how long.



2. Next, by clicking on **Courses** in the top left corner, you will be allowed to see all of the classes available. Click on a language to begin!
3. Once you've chosen a language, you will be asked whether you would like to launch your Language in Basic or Complete 2.0. Your choice will vary depending on how much you already know or would like to know. *NOTE: Make sure you have Javascript and an update Adobe Flash Player to begin learning!*



4. All of the language classes follow the same basic format. Flashcards will appear that have phrases you can learn. The answer will appear underneath, accompanied by the proper pronunciation. Hear native speakers say the phrases to you, and even use a voice comparison. Each lesson within a chapter will have specific conversational and grammar-related goals.
