## The Best of The Short Environmental Films (under 10min)

Two Film Comparison – Extra Credit Due Tues. Nov 29th

If one thing has over the past decade, it is been a shift in the focus, quality, and quantity of environmental films. As the YouTube, Vimeo, Instagram, TikTok and festivals such as Banff, Telluride and Wild & Scenic give testament to, the BAR has been raised, if not altogether reformulated when it comes to combining adventure with **SIGNIFICANT ENVIRONMENTALLY-THEMED Films.** 

Here's your chance to select, critique, and compare two such exemplars of the craft.

Over the next week, you will need to track down <u>two</u> **EXCELLENT EXAMPLES of** short films (under 10min) on the environmental issues and then write a comparison of the two films (comparing and contrasting their approaches in story-craft, character development, visuals, music, editing, nat-sound, and other production techniques).

**Obviously**, you should **NOT** use films which we have already seen in class or at Telluride/Mtn film. View/screen widely and don't simply take someone else's word for the "best" film for granted. By all means, DO NOT use films which you've seen in other classes.

Additional guidelines:

- 1. <u>Research the backstory</u> of the film's conceptualization, production, distribution, and reception. Gather as much information as you can to inform, but not overwhelm your comparison.
- 2. Track down any "interviews" and/or profiles with the producers of the films. Include the links with your submission.
- 3. Try <u>Contacting</u> and speaking/corresponding with the film's **producer(s)** to get background information not identified in your research info.
- 4. Write up a 2-3 page (single spaced) paper which (a) synthesizes your background research, and (b) compares/contrasts the MAJOR PRODUCTION TACTICS used in the two films.

## Lastly,

You will want to focus your comparison to films within a particular genre or issue advocacy

Include links to the films with your comparison if possible.
