








Global Tourism's Meteoric Rise


- The United Nations
 World Tourism
 Organization (UNWTO)
 estimates that
 internationally there
 were just 25 million
 tourist arrivals in 1950.
- ► 68 years later this number has increased to 1.4 billion international arrivals per year.
- ► This is a 56% increase
- ≥2023 another 15.5% increase is projected.
- ►~\$854 Billion in ONE year
- ► 2026 projection → \$1.5 Trillion





The World's Top Tourist Destinations by Money Spent International Tourism Receipts in 2018 (US\$ billion)*




- Revenues generated from tourists have grown faster than the world economy.


While not a full-on ban, Mumbai police are instituting patrols in zones where selfie mishaps are most common, like the city's oceanfront promenade, a popular pedestrian area. Most recently, two teenagers drowned while trying to get that perfect aquatic backdrop, the latest in a string of snap-related deaths around the country. India leads the world in deaths-by-selfie: Of 49 globally recorded fatalities over the past 3 years, nearly 40 percent have occurred there.

Authorities are investigating a group of swimmers accused of "aggressively" harassing a pod of dolphins off Hawaii's Big Island.

Swimming with dolphins is a popular tourist activity in Hawaii but federal law bans swimming within 50 yards (45 metres) of spinner dolphins.

Hawaii authorities said they came upon the 33 swimmers in Honaunau Bay on Sunday during a routine patrol.

Drone footage of the swimmers has also been released.
