

Newspapers: Daily Readership by Age


Percentage nationally who read any daily newspaper yesterday



Media Change: Network TV News


Network TV: Evening News Overall Viewership Since 1980


November-to-November average viewers per night for all three networks (NBC, CBS, ABC), in millions




News consumption patterns across media platforms

The American News in Freefall

- Since 2000, of American staff newspaper photographers have been laid off. 43 per cent
- As a percentage, more print journalists have lost their jobs than workers in any other significant American industry over the last decade (Guardian).
- 2013 The Chicago Sun-Times laid off its ENTIRE photography staff (including Pulitzer Prize Winner John White) https://petapixel.com/2013/05/30/how-the-internet-killed-photojournalism/
- 2016 the New York Times relied on freelancers to provide 50 percent or more of its visuals
 - The Wall Street Journal relied on freelancers for 66
 percent of its features imagery and 33 percent of its news
 imagery;
 - The Washington Post relied on freelancers for 80 percent of its international news imagery, 50 percent of its political news imagery, and between 60 and 80 percent of its national news imagery






INTERNATIONAL NEWS in the U.S.: Retreating from the World

Jodi Enda (American Journalism Review)

- ✓In the US, foreign news coverage dropped 53% from 1985-2010
- ☑Closing of foreign offices/bureaus = 20 major U.S. newspapers closed ALL foreign bureaus.
- ☑NPR, the only US news organization, which increased foreign coverage.
- ☑Three types of foreign news
 - 1. Wire Services (Reuters, AP, etc.)
 - 2. Foreign Bureaus
 - 3. Freelancers ("Parachute Journalism/Reporting")
- ☑Global Post (organization of in-country free lancers)
 - ✓ No regular pay or medical coverage.
 - **☑** Crisis Reporting/ Crisis Zones
- ☑Modules—LATimes packages modules for other Tribune papers

BBC News

- ✓ BBC News is the largest broadcast news gathering operation in the world.
- ✓ Foreign correspondents in ~200 countries
- **✓** 40+ Different Languages
- ✓ Crisis News: all time peaks of some 1 billion total hits. At peak times during the day there were 40,000 page requests per second for the BBC News website.
- ✓ 187 million Radio Listeners World News Service
- ✓ 388 million TV Households



British Broadcasting Service

- Established in 1927. The longest established and largest news broadcaster in the world.
- ✓ A publicly owned corporation that operates under a Royal Charter.
 - Legally independent from direct government intervention.
 - Operations are overseen by 12 Governors who are appointed by the Crown on the advice
 of the Government.
- ✓ "Guaranteed" income. The BBC is funded principally by an annual television license fee, which is charged to all United Kingdom households, companies and organizations.






Full time distribution:




